

The following bills of interest to the DOT were not included in the 2009 Iowa Acts because they were item vetoed by Governor Culver:

HF 809 (item vetoed)

Section 1, subsection 4, was item vetoed and prohibited the Department of Administrative Services from exceeding the rates set as of January 1, 2009, for services provided solely by the Department of Administrative Services to other executive branch agencies or departments.

Section 30, subsection 3, was item vetoed and allowed for moneys in the Highway Materials and Equipment Revolving Fund for the purchase of motor vehicles by the DOT in excess of the amount determined necessary for motor vehicle maintenance and insurance costs for the applicable fiscal period to be returned to the DOT.

Note: The Governor item vetoed other sections of this bill that are of no interest to the DOT.

SF 478 (item vetoed)

Section 21 was item vetoed and required the Department of Administrative Services to conduct a job evaluation study of state employees for the purpose of determining whether the job classification and pay grade level of selected state employees are properly determined.

Designated portions of lettered paragraph c and numbered paragraph 3 of Section 27 were item vetoed. Lettered paragraph c required notification of the Legislative Council before any reduction is made of supervisory positions. Numbered paragraph 3 required that priority be given to eliminate or reduce middle management employee positions and required the Department of Management to report on out-of-state travel.

Section 78 was item vetoed and provided that a person whose license had been administratively revoked for an operating while intoxicated (OWI) test failure after a prior OWI revocation for one year could apply after 45 days for a temporary restricted license.

Note: The Governor item vetoed other sections of this bill that are of no interest to the DOT.
